

There are a multitude of islands nestled in the Med, but only Cyprus can lay claim to being the birthplace of Aphrodite, the Ancient Greek Goddess of Love.

Seamlessly blending a rich, multi-layered past with a modern infrastructure and contemporary lifestyle, Cyprus may be the third-largest island in the Mediterranean, but it's still surprisingly compact, making it easy to explore the shimmering shorelines, natural landscapes and wealth of attractions – both old and new – with plenty of time to stop and linger along the way.

The sunny climate (more than 300 days of sunshine each year) provides an ideal setting for nature trails; archaeological odysseys; mountain biking, hiking, cycling and golf; bird-watching; wine routes; watersports, water parks and more, all year round. It has all the right ingredients for an exciting family fairytale too.

The maritime capital of Cyprus – Limassol, or Lemesos – is historic, multifaceted and lively, with a range of coastal strips, shopping options, drinking, dining and entertainment; an up-to-the-minute marina; and a distinctive link to the age-old tradition of viticulture. It also offers all the elements for a relaxing beach break or an unhurried expedition of classical discovery.

Paphos, meanwhile, is Cyprus' Capital of Culture: where legends of love, magnificent mosaics, ancient awes and compelling coasts make this small town utterly enlightening to explore and beautiful to behold. Comprised of its old and new towns – its harbour and medieval castle being the focal point – this region boasts quaint enclaves further afield, including Polis and the fishing port of Latchi. It's also home to the stunning Akamas Peninsula and its Avakas Gorge; Lara Beach (where green turtles nest from May to August); and of course Petra tou Romiou (Aphrodite's Rock) where, with just one look at its surrounding blue swirl, you'll soon get a sense of why Cyprus has attracted so many throughout the millennia, and why even Aphrodite herself could not bear to leave.

EUROPE



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ANASSA



Famed for its prime Akamas Peninsula location, traditional Byzantine-village-style setting, and unerring service, Anassa is a refined hillside retreat that cascades down through vibrant, flower-filled gardens to the golden beach. Light, bright and oh-so-stylish, most of the 166 classical low-rise rooms, beach-chic suites and thoughtful multigenerational havens offer stellar views of the Med, and an additional four first-rate villas boast beguiling infinity pools and oodles of privacy.

Owned and run by Thanos, Natasha and Anna Michaelides, family is at the core of Anassa's philosophy. Their multi-award-winning kids' club caters to children from four months to 12 years and boasts an extensive range of sensational activities like junior sports camps, baking, treasure hunts, archaeology and spa treatments. Early restaurant sittings are another fabulous feature; and the brilliant 'Baby Go Lightly' service facilitates the seemingly impossible: travelling light with little ones in-tow!

But grown-ups won't feel left out as there's plenty for them too... Sneak off to the Thalassa Spa for marine treatments and detoxifying spa packages, or bask under the sun at the two outdoor freshwater pools. Get active with land- and watersports, a PADI Five Star Gold Palm Dive Centre and RYA Sailing Centre; or choose from the collection of curated experiences, from horse-riding through the Cypriot countryside or exploring the rugged Troodos Mountains, to winetasting at the Byzantine Chrysorroygiatissa monastery. World-class food establishments, meanwhile, include the romantic gourmet Asian fusion Basiliko, the alfresco fine-dining restaurant Helios, and a calendar of beachside barbecues and Cypriot village fairs celebrating local culture throughout the season.

Escape the ordinary at Columbia Beach Resort, tucked away on the south coast in a setting of unspoilt countryside – just 20 minutes from Paphos and 30 minutes from Limassol. At the centre of a quiet, mile-long Blue Flag beach, gently ambling from the crystal-clear waters of the sheltered Bay of Pissouri, this low-rise lovely follows the landscape's organic incline, so most of the 169 suites have an absolutely spectacular view.

A treat for all foodies, there's no shortage of flavours to discover, from the Apollo Tavern's fresh local fare, to a celebration of the finest Italian gourmet cuisine at Bacchus. Unique to Cyprus, there are á la carte meal plan options of bed and breakfast, half board and full board. And, with a choice of six bars, there's always somewhere different to relax with a drink and soak up those elysian vistas.

In addition to sunbathing poolside and relaxing at the Spa, a break here also provides the perfect opportunity to spend quality time together, as a couple, a family, or a group of friends.

So, whether you want to take on Cyprus' championship golf courses, scuba-dive beneath the waves, enjoy an array of watersports, discover the area by bike, or immerse yourself in a world of imaginative culinary adventures, there's always plenty to do. And The Den Kids' Club has no shortage of ways to keep 4–12-year-olds constantly entertained, so you can be confident that your little ones are in very safe hands.



Its miles of beaches are its main draws (La Pelosa in Stintino and Cala Brandinchi in San Teodoro are undoubtedly the most spellbinding), but there are all kinds of other activities.

Explore the mysterious ancient structures of the Su Nuraxi di Barumini (the only UNESCO-listed monument here) or the otherworldly Neptune's Grotto near Alghero. Hike the trails and raft the river at the Gola di Gorropu, or visit colourful mountain towns like Orgosolo with its creative street art. And a day trip out to the magnificent Maddalena archipelago and national park is also a must, where you'll find even more of the region's finest nature, hiking and diving opportunities.

IBIZA

Unadulterated Ibizan indulgence embraced by gorgeous terrain – this allsuite sanctuary has a prime vantage point for enjoying sensational sunsets.

In an altogether one-of-a-kind location, encircled by a pine grove on Ibiza's west coast cliffs, between the superlative Cala Conta and secluded Cala Codolar beaches (both in easy walking distance), this white-washed, Ibizan-inspired village is spread over 56,000 square-metres of verdant gardens. Set within three distinct areas: the Ibicenco Village, The Laguna and The Cliff, 185 suites feature a terrace or balcony looking over the gardens or sea, depending on their location and orientation. Some feature a private pool, while two four-bedroom Grand Villas boast private gardens, spacious living areas, inviting infinity pools and sun terraces with sweeping sea views.

Elsewhere, you'll find three pools: the vast adults-only infinity pool with sunken bar, the child-friendly pool at Laguna Village, and the pool at the Pure Seven Spa (the soul of 7Pines, dedicated to holistic, wellbeing opportunities). There's also clifftop yoga, a planetarium, underwater photography lessons and a kids' club. Out and about, there are charters on-board the two 24-metre Pershing yachts, plus exhilarating guided outdoor activities including pine forest hikes, mountain biking, kayaking, stand-up paddle excursions, cliff-diving, running trails and quad and buggy tours.

And there's a host of culinary discoveries from morning til night, with everything from hearty breakfasts and late lunches to sunset tapas, special guest-chef appearances and cooking classes. The highlights? Sunset rituals at The Cone Club – the hottest spot in Ibiza to kick back with a cocktail; and the tasting menu at The View, a one-of-a-kind gastronomic experience curated by Executive Chef Oscar Salazar.



SARDINIA

Cradled within the natural contours of Baja Sardinia in the north, you'll find a serene oasis of 75 rooms and suites set in 37 acres of fragrant gardens.

A singular blend of untouched beauty, superb service, and a touch of exclusivity, beguiling outlooks over the rocky cove of Cala Bitta create an instant connection to the surroundings; and inviting paths weave their way down to two small sheltered coves, where the iridescent waters lap the warm sands.

An enticing variety of rooms, junior suites and suites are set in three distinct locations scattered around the grounds: the Gardens, surrounded by a green curtain of flora and fauna and steps from the main pool; Laguna, an adults-only collection of large rooms and suites grouped around the tranquil Laguna pool; and Sea View, the most coveted and the closest to the shore (where some accommodations have a rooftop terrace, and others, alfresco hot tubs or direct beach access). All are decked out in a calm, contemporary palette, with mirror walls and sheer glass panels that make the most of the sunlight and scenery.

Amenities include the Pure Seven Spa, which may not be 'all-singing, all-dancing' but the massages are excellent! Families are welcomed with open arms, and the hotel offers a kids' club, paddle courts, and basketball facilities.

Mealtimes are a real treat too. Each of the three restaurants has its own distinctive vibe and tempting epicurean outings, and the Cone Club is where mellow days on the beach are followed by evenings of music and merriment. As the first of its kind on Sardinia, it's a real hot spot for in-house guests and non-residents alike, with full-service daybeds, a bar-lounge, good vibes, great music and outstanding food.

the location

Sardinia is one of the most enchanting islands in the Med. Fabled for its long shorelines and exceptional elemental beauty, it's comparable to the Caribbean or Indian Ocean and just under three hours from the UK. The superlative south coast provides a splendid, safe and tranquil setting for Forte Village – a rarified resort, 45 minutes from Cagliari Airport, looking out onto the golden sands between Santa Margherita di Pula and Capo Spartivento.

NATIONAL PARKS OF THE USA

God Bless You America! So many awe-inspiring, historic national parks, monuments, recreation areas and nature preserves... particularly across the Southwest. Here's our guide to those worth delving into, and how to pick between them when you're short on time.

MONUMENT VALLEY, ARIZONA VS VALLEY OF THE GODS, UTAH

Almost everyone travelling through the American West will try to include Monument Valley in their itinerary. And with good reason. It's an iconic symbol of the region, and the sacred heart of the Navajo Nation, home to towering sandstone rock formations sculpted over time and soaring 400 to 1000 feet above the valley floor. It truly is one of the natural wonders of the world.

Most sightseers explore the famous 17-mile scenic loop in private vehicles (although it's actually more like 11 miles, and generally takes about two hours, giving you a rough idea of the road conditions and volume of visitors). Or you can take a half- or full-day Jeep tour to explore the area's back roads and sacred lands with the help of a local guide. Either way, be prepared for the crowds, which may dull the shine of the expedition aspect a little.

But that's where our hidden gem comes in. What many visitors to Monument Valley don't know is that just 40 miles northeast of here lies another geographical masterpiece – the Valley of the Gods – a somewhat smaller scale version of Monument Valley with a similar topography (isolated buttes, towering pinnacles and wide-open spaces that seem to go on forever) – but much, much less traffic, thereby adding solitude to its many virtues.

And nothing beats driving through nature's wonders without the disturbance of other tourists (though because of its isolated nature and dirt road, we'd definitely recommend a high clearance vehicle here). And, without any facilities, gas stations, stores or services, do make sure you're fully equipped for the day before you head in).

Like its larger, more celebrated neighbour, you'll explore the Valley of the Gods and all its intriguingly named monoliths (Setting Hen, Rooster and Seven Sailors Buttes, De Gaulle and His Troops, and Lady in the Bathtub) on the scenic 17-mile unpaved loop (considered by those in the know as one of the best in Southern Utah).

It's one of the most underrated trails too. And, unlike Monument Valley – which is a Navajo Tribal Park, and not a US National Park – there are no tribal restrictions or permits required, no established hiking trails and, best of all, no entrance fee – so it's a great place to escape the crowds, roam free, and see the finer things that Canyon Country has to offer.





ZION NATIONAL PARK VS BRYCE CANYON NATIONAL PARK, UTAH

Even if you have to choose between Zion and Bryce due to lack of time or resources, you can still expect to have your socks knocked off – both are beautiful beyond belief, equally offbeat and, despite being just 90 minutes and 83.8 miles apart, they offer drastic differences in the terrain and scenery you'll encounter.

If time is an issue, then the first thing you'll want to consider is where you'll be arriving from. Heading in from Salt Lake City? Then Bryce is your best bet. Or, if you're coming in from Las Vegas, then Zion would save you a considerable amount of travel time.

Zion sets itself apart in size (it's much bigger than Bryce), stature, and environment too. It's like the set of a movie that's so grand you know it's fake, but you don't care because it's delicious to look at. And with lots of famous slot canyons, and extremely diverse elevations and rock formations (the must-sees being Kolob Canyons, Kolob Terrace, Main Canyon and East Side), it's just begging for exploration, especially when you do have more time.


It's also perfect for keen hikers who want to really get under the skin of it all, though it is worth noting that the trails here can be extremely challenging. If Zion sounds more up your street, but time really is of the essence, then one of our two favourite hikes (depending on your level of experience) will give you a good flavour of everything this park has to offer.

The Narrows is one of the world's best slot canyon hikes which takes you along (and into) the Virgin River – so expect to get wet! Take the hike from the bottom up – it's the best route for first-time river hikers and is easy-to-moderate during the summer months.

And then there's Angels Landing – one of the world's most unforgettable, bucket-list-worthy short-adventure hikes – but this one's not for the faint-hearted. Running along a narrow rock fin with dizzying drop-offs on both sides, it culminates on a lofty perch with prime panoramic views of Zion Canyon's 270-million-year-old rock layers. Anyone in an average physical condition can make this heavenward trek, but it can be mentally challenging with its steep switchbacks and sheer drop-offs.

In comparison to Zion, Bryce is much smaller, more unusual, and its more immediate WOW factor makes it great if you're particularly short on time. It's a fabulous place to lose yourself in nature's fantastical artistry, where vivacious vistas and curious sorbet-coloured, sandcastle-like spires and hoodoos provide endless treats for the eyes – especially the epic Amphitheatre and Thor's Hammer. The high elevation extends awesome opportunities for stargazing, the high altitude means cooler temperatures than at other Utah parks, and the hiking is much easier too.

If you fancy something a bit different, the mule trip down into the canyon is well worth experiencing. And if time does allow, sunrise here is definitely not to be missed.






YOSEMITE NATIONAL PARK VS SEQUOIA & KINGS CANYON NATIONAL PARKS, CALIFORNIA

Ask anyone who's been to both Yosemite and Sequoia to choose between the two, and nine out of 10 people will undoubtedly tell you to pick the 1100-square-mile UNESCO World Heritage Site of Yosemite. After all, it's the most revisited of all of America's National Parks, with a treasure trove of wild wonders that – even though you've seen them many times before in pictures or on the big screen - you'll still gasp out loud when you see them in person. Plus there are thousands of waterfalls - from soaring spectacles with a half-mile of cascading water, to tiny streams of white that drop only a few feet - and the overall feeling of being enveloped within a towering temple of nature. In fact, stand in Yosemite Valley, turn 360 degrees and, in just 60 seconds, you'll see more marvels of nature here than you would in an entire day pretty much anywhere else in the world. From black bears, mule deer and chipmunks; white-flowering dogwood trees and the Merced River; to countless waterfalls (including the mighty Yosemite, Bridalveil and Sentinel Falls), the striking rock formations of El Capitan and Half Dome, and more exploits than you can imagine, you'll find it all here.

But Sequoia has its own menu of magic too. Closer to LA than Yosemite, the impressive collection of sequoias in Giant Forest, along The Generals Highway, and in Grant Grove, are as big as buildings, and the park is generally less crowded than Yosemite (particularly come July and August – the hottest and most-crowded months, and when the famous waterfalls are not at peak flow).

It's also one of California's most enchanting national parks, with some of the Sierra's most mind-blowing mountains and gargantuan fauna (including Mount Whitney – the continental US's tallest peak; and the General Sherman Tree – the world's largest tree by volume and one of its oldest at the grand old age of over 2300 years). And it's where you'll find the secret underground world of the Crystal Cave – a hidden gem of ornate marble, polished by subterranean streams and decorated with curtains of icicle-like stalactites and mounds of stalagmites. Don't miss a climb up Moro Rock for knock-your-socks-off views of the western half of Sequoia National Park and the Great Western Divide either; and remember, your admission to Sequoia gets you into the adjacent Kings Canyon National Park too.








AMANDARI, Bali


Perched on an escarpment high above the winding Ayung River Gorge, and 10 minutes from the arts community of Ubud in the verdant heartland, Amandari, or 'peaceful spirits' – designed in the style of a traditional Balinese village – serves up a singular setting from which to immerse yourself in all of the region's superb activities, outdoor endeavours and wellness, not to mention the cultural richness of Bali's artistic centre, and its mountainous region to the north.

Winding pebbled walkways link the 31 thatched-roof suites with the open-sided restaurant, bar, 32-metre swimming pool, library, gym and Aman Spa. Surrounded by high paras-stone walls for privacy, each suite is accessed via a Balinese-style gateway and enjoys a garden courtyard, an indoor living area and full-height sliding glass doors that open on three sides to lush surroundings. Outlooks and layouts vary, with some overlooking the valley and rice paddies, and a number feature a duplex configuration, a plunge pool and additional rooms. Serviced by two staff, there's also a three-bedroom villa tucked into rice terraces less than a minute's drive from the resort, complete with a private garden, landscaped deck and dining bale, all embracing the expansive, two-tiered swimming pool.

AMANPULO, THE PHILIPPINES

Blissfully marooned in the Cuyo Archipelago of northern Palawan in the Philippines, accessible via private plane from Manila in just 70 minutes, Amanpulo is a consummately safe, secluded private island hideaway, fringed with powder-white sands and lapped by calm clear seas. Offering a complete 'back to nature' experience in supreme comfort, its pristine sands are nesting sites for hawksbill and green sea turtles; and the clear waters offer superb snorkelling and scuba-diving on the surrounding four square miles of vibrant coral reef.

Scattered across Amanpulo, all 42 Treetop, Hillside and Beach Casitas fulfil the promise of a solitary sojourn; while 18 villas – designed for seamless indoor-outdoor living – rest serenely on the shoreline. Palm-lined sandy pathways lead to a selection of seasonal food venues, with fresh ingredients sourced from the flourishing organic farm; as well as the Aman Spa, Sea Sports Hut, Dive Centre, Kite and Surf Centre, deserted coves and jungle-clad lookouts.
